One of Us: To Communicate and Demonstrate

Re-read: John 14:1-11

1. What is the most significant story of Jesus you remember being taught growing up?
2. What is the difference between *learning about* Jesus and *believing in* Jesus?
3. What objection do you hear most often from people unsure about faith or Christianity?
4. Read Ch. 14, verse 1-3, Jesus told his followers that he was leaving them but not to worry. Why did he tell them not to worry, what was his rationale?
5. Think about one thing you tend to worry over. What do you think Jesus would tell you about the things that you worry about?
6. Read verses 4-6. How do you think the disciples felt about Jesus response to Thomas.
7. Read verse 8. How do you think your approach to everyday life would change if you received absolute assurance that God knows you and what you're going through?
8. What do we learn about God from Jesus in this passage?
9. Pastor Jon said in his message, that if you move past Jesus you're moving away from God. What does that mean to you?
10. One reason God become one of us was "to communicate and to demonstrate what God is like." In light of this and based on Jesus' overall message, what do you think God thinks about when he thinks about you?
